




NPAIHB Member Tribes





Organizational Chart






Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs

Warm Springs


- 30 45 minutes travel to clinic
- Not everyone has a vehicle
- Difficulty accessing fresh fruits and vegetables
- High desert geography
- Complex history with Indian Health Services





Warm Springs Health and Wellness Center

- Primary care clinic, over 100 staff
- Medical, dental, optometry pharmacy, laboratory, radiology and podiatry services



Figure 7: 2015 IHS Expenditures Per Capita and Other Federal Health Care Expenditures Per Capita





Community Clinical Linkage

- Created environmental scan
 - Piloted
- Community Clinical Linkage
 - Four interviews
- Clinical presentation Native Clinic
 - Dr. Bruegl
 - Dr. Empey



- All doing immunizations
- Following IHS immunization protocol
- Focusing on strategies back to school physicals
- HPV standing orders in place at the clinic
- Immunization package used Electronic Health Record
- Utilize state program vaccine supplies in especially in the Urban area
- Reminders for shots cards and calls
- Utilizing community health nurse
- Emphasize cancer prevention
- Promoted as part of the immunization recommendations
- Information provided in the clinic parents
- Sports camps community events back to school picnics
- Community health has a close relationship with clinic

Findings (continued)

- Women's health and WIC programs and head start
- New medical director, very engaged in women's health
- Provide Immunization clinics
- Parents and especially grandparents are skeptical of the shot
- All but one have immunization coordinator
- Utilize county coordinator
 - Rates are low but small population
- IHS and tribal clinic have relatively high rates for the first shot
 - Fall off on the second and third



- Don't know enough
- Afraid of side effects
- Mistrust of medical system
- Mistrust of federal government
- Remember past of women being sterilized

From interviews

- Parents and especially grandparents are skeptical of the shot
- Emphasize cancer prevention
- Community incident with patient fainting

From article on HPV immunizations in the NW

- Patients' distrust of the medical system
- Anxiety about pain or side effects of the injections
- Lack of education materials
- Overall lack of funding
- Apprehension of federal government
- Remember past of women being sterilized

Lessons Learned

- NTCCP works in a three state area, one state is very inclusive
- The state task group already reaches out to multiple staff at my organization
- AI/AN target population is already showing good rates for immunizations
- Concentrate on need to be able to focus on issues in individual clinics that we work with
- NPAIHB partners invested
 - Clinical application coordinator, who is a pharmacist, the IRB coordinator, the comprehensive cancer director and specialist, OHSU, ACS, and NTCCP director is a member of the National HPV roundtable
- In addition, it would be great to develop a media blitz, specific to our population and get that out
- There is an abundant amount of resources; it is just assuring that the information is getting to the clinics and health educators on a regular basis



 In Summary, several tribes will hopefully benefit from our efforts, as the NTCCP we will continue to work with our tribes to increase HPV vaccinations in our tribal clinics
